What are they doing?

On May 22nd, 2010, Sam Wade, Fred Tsai, Brian Tong and Tevis Bateman will set out from Victoria, BC. This 8000 km trip consists of a variety of obstacles such as the Rocky Mountains, swarms of black flies, and devastating winds; all of which make eight hours of biking a day no easy feat. Approximately eighty days later, they will reach their destination of St. John's, Newfoundland.

Who is involved?

Created by Sam Wade, Simple Acts of Charitable Kindness (SACK) is a group of people dedicated to promoting altruism. This group, now 97 members, takes part in activities once a month which benefit the community and those living in it. Many activities have already been done, but this project is much larger than any attempted before. Sam hopes that through this group, and this project, he will be able to enlighten and encourage those around him in order for communities to reach their super-ordinate goals.

More importantly, why?

Although all of their altruistic personalities have led them to want to participate in this ride, the sole inspiration for this journey is Sam's grandfather, currently recovering from prostate cancer. Sam hopes, through their efforts, to inspire others to help one another.

All of the money raised from the bike trip will go directly to The Prostate Centre in Victoria, BC. The Prostate Centre, a self-supporting non-profit organization founded in 2000, sets the standard for easing the burden of prostate cancer by providing unbiased and understandable medical information and support on prostate cancer and prostate health issues. The Centre emphasizes the importance of early detection and is dedicated to prevention and research of prostate cancer.
